General

SPONSOR: The Ontario Risk and Insurance Management Society (ORIMS).

PURPOSE:

The Donald M. Stuart award was established in 1979 by ORIMS to recognize outstanding contributions in the field of risk and insurance management in Canada. The Award seeks to increase the visibility of the risk management profession both internally in member corporations, and externally throughout the Chapter, the Society, the Industry, and the Community.

ELIGIBILITY:

Any Organizational Professional, Individual Professional or retired Professional Member of one of the Canadian Chapters of the Risk and Insurance Management Society (RIMS) can be nominated. The candidate may be nominated by anyone familiar with his or her work, such as a superior, the risk management staff, a colleague with another company, or service provider/industry partner.

At the discretion of the ORIMS Board of Directors, nominations of past RIMS members or a posthumous nomination may be considered to recognize an outstanding contribution in the field of risk management.

AWARD COMMITTEE:

The nomination will be judged by a panel of 8 professionals representing all aspects of risk management and the commercial insurance industry in Canada. In addition, the Committee will also seek the participation of a former recipient of the Award.

AWARD:

Each candidate will be scored by the judges on five criteria. The candidate with the highest aggregate score will be announced as the recipient of the Donald M. Stuart Award at the annual RIMS Canada Conference. The Award Committee reserves the right to withhold presentation of the award in any given year(s) or to change the date and location of the Award presentation.

AWARD CANDIDATE CRITERIA

RULES & REGULATIONS

The Donald M. Stuart Award was established by the Ontario Risk and Insurance Management Society (ORIMS), the Ontario Chapter of the Risk and Insurance Management Society (RIMS), to recognize outstanding contributions to the field of Risk Management in Canada by a Professional Member of any of the Canadian Chapters of RIMS.

The rules and regulations governing the Award are as follows:

1. The Award

- a. The Award shall be called the “Donald M. Stuart Award”. It was established in order to recognize outstanding contributions by eligible members of any of the Canadian Chapters of RIMS in the field of risk and insurance management.
- b. The Award shall consist of a distinctive piece of Canadian art sculpture (or other suitable gift) mounted on a base with a suitably engraved plaque, as approved by the ORIMS Board of Directors.
- c. The Award shall be presented annually by the Vice President (or his/her designate) at the annual RIMS Canada Conference. If the recipient is unable to attend the RIMS Canada Conference, the Award will be presented in absentia to the most senior member of the recipient’s Chapter who, in turn, will arrange presentation of the Award to the recipient by his/her Chapter at a suitable time and place.
- d. The ORIMS Board of Directors shall have the discretion to change the time and place of the presentation of the Award.
- e. The ORIMS Board of Directors shall have the discretion to waive nominating a candidate in any given year should there be no qualifying candidate in that year.

2. Eligibility

Any Organizational Professional, Individual Professional or Retired Professional member of the Canadian Chapters of RIMS is eligible. At the discretion of the ORIMS Board of Directors, nominations of past RIMS members or a posthumous nomination may be considered.

3. Performance Qualifications

The Award is granted for outstanding contributions to the field of risk and insurance management in Canada. “Contributions”, embraces service by the nominee at the Provincial, Federal or International level and could include (but not necessarily be restricted to the) activities that are described in the Five Award Candidate Criteria above.

4. Procedure

- a. Annually, the ORIMS Board of Directors shall appoint an Award Committee to administer this Award. This Committee shall consist of eight members, as follows:
 - ORIMS President

- ORIMS Vice-President (Chairperson of Donald M. Stuart Award committee)
- ORIMS Director of Education or Director of Industry Relations/External Affairs
- ORIMS Director of Communications
- One (1) Organizational member from either the RIMS Chapter of the British Columbia, Southern Alberta, Northern Alberta, Saskatchewan or Manitoba.
- One (1) Organizational member from either the RIMS Chapter of the Canadian Capital Region, Quebec, Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, P.E.I., or Newfoundland.
- One (1) prominent member of the Eastern Canada insurance industry or insurance press community.
- One (1) prominent member of the Western Canada insurance industry or insurance press community.
- The Committee will also encourage the participation of a former recipient of the Award.

In the event of the withdrawal of any members(s) of the Award Committee for any reason including conflict of interest, ORIMS Board of Directors will appoint the appropriate replacement(s) in accordance with the above guidelines.

- b. The Chairperson of the Award Committee shall announce and call for nominations for the Award.
- c. Any eligible member of a Canadian Chapter of RIMS may be nominated by anyone familiar with his/her work such as a superior, the risk management staff, service provider/peer industry partner.
- d. All Nomination forms must be submitted to the Chairperson of the Award Committee by **MAY 23RD** or at such later date as may be required following the request for nominations.
 - a. The Award Committee will review all nominations and determine the final eligible candidates for the final selection process by **JUNE 6th**.
 - b. Each nominating sponsor will be notified of the judges' decision whether they are to proceed to Part 2 of the Nomination Process, by **JUNE 20TH**. Sponsors of the eligible candidate will then be required to provide the final supporting documentation.
 - c. Final supporting documentation must be submitted to the Chairperson of the Award Committee by **JUNE 30TH**.
 - d. All timelines may be adjusted as necessary, at the discretion of the ORIMS Board of Directors.
 - e. While only one Award may be granted each year, the Award Committee shall have the right to recommend to the Board to decline to grant such Award in any given year or to alter/waive the nomination process and grant the award to a former Risk Manager (including posthumously) provided such person meets the criteria.
 - f. Decisions of the Award Committee based on a majority of the eight members' votes (excluding the Chairperson's vote, unless the vote results in a tie, in which case the Chairperson votes to break the tie), shall remain final.

Amendments to this award package have been passed by the Board of Directors of ORIMS on March 31, 1993, December 6, 1995, December 13, 2005, January 31, 2019 and March 21, 2024.

4. Provide as much detail as possible using single-spaced typing on the forms provided.
5. The information will be held in strictest confidence by the judges and will not be released without permission of the winning candidate.
6. The candidate may be involved in the preparation of the nomination; in fact, the candidate's participation is encouraged as they will be able to provide the detail required.
7. The final Nomination form - PART 2 and all related material and supporting documentation must be submitted and received by ORIMS on or before JUNE 30th.
